Name of Society	Uses a creative and appropriate name that captures the spirit of the new society.	
Declaration of Independence	States reasons for formation of the new society and explains those reasons with detailed evidence. Language is appropriate for a formal government statement.	
Utopian Motto and Seal	Provide a clear representation of the aspects of the society upon which the utopia is founded. Language is clear, and images appropriate.	
Utopian Animal	Includes a pictures and description of the animal that best represents the utopia. Description clearly provides the rationale for the selection and makes strong connections to the beliefs upon which the society is founded.	
List of Rules	Includes clear rules for appropriate behavior that are in line with the beliefs upon which the society is founded. Reasons for the rules are well-detailed.	
Governing Body	Outlines the system of government that oversees the society, using formal language appropriate for a government document. Rationales are clearly explained.	
Invitation to Friends	Persuades friends to join the society, giving clear reasons why the utopia is appropriate for them. Uses casual, semi-formal language to engage readers.	
Journal Entries	Includes 3 entries for different days that describe and reflect upon life in the utopia. Entries are written in informal language.	
Daily Itinerary	Outlines a complete, time-based schedule for the daily events of citizens. Activities clearly align with the beliefs upon which the society is founded.	
Advertisement	Presents life in the utopia in a clear message that engages potential citizens. The details in the ad clearly align with the beliefs upon which the society is founded.
